

Principles and Platform - Do They Really Matter Anymore?

Dazzled by star power, the wealth and popularity of a movie star, the latest polls, and the fear tactics of splitting the vote and allowing a democrat to win, some Republicans and other traditional pro-life conservatives have already decided to jump ship, not stand by true principles or the Republican platform and vote for Arnold Schwarzenegger in the California re-call election, October 7. Others are confused, wondering what they should do. Perhaps this article and the Eagle Forum voter guide will help you make up your mind.

Before writing this article, I checked the website for the California Republican Party. Yes, the platform has not been changed. It is still pro-life, pro-traditional family values, pro-traditional marriage, pro-2nd amendment, property rights, immigration control, no racial partiality, less government, and less taxes. Yet, that platform does not seem to matter any more, as the party leadership chose to endorse Schwarzenegger, a candidate for governor who stands for none of the above, has absolutely no experience in politics, and has not even bothered to vote in the past 13 years.

Arnold has stated in various interviews that he is pro-choice, supports domestic partners, finds nothing wrong with the homosexual life-style; he just happens to prefer being heterosexual. (He has even been endorsed by the "Log-Cabin Republicans," the gay Republican organization in California.) He supports the Brady Bill and other gun control laws. He does not share typical Republican beliefs on property rights, has liberal environmental viewpoints and has even appointed an extreme environmentalist to his team of advisors. He says he is a fiscal conservative who will cut taxes (unless there is an emergency – whatever that could mean). But does a fiscal conservative give large

liberal causes as he has? Since 1979 he has supported with large sums of money every Kennedy who has run for office, who all believe strongly in more government and more government controls and higher taxes.

Here are some other recent revelations on the political views of Schwarzenegger which are totally opposite of the Republican platform: In the debate held September 24, between the top five candidates, Arnold stated that California should provide healthcare for all illegal immigrant children, and everyone in the state must be insured – how can that happen without added costs to the state, is that an emergency that might cause the raising of taxes? Does that not smack of Hillary's "socialized medicine," a very liberal viewpoint? Arnold implied that the California Teachers Association, (a very liberal, pro-democratic group) should control what goes on in education. His after-school programs are something the CTA, NEA would totally support. They believe in getting children out of the care (and influence) of parents as much and as early as possible. The debate also revealed Arnold's views supporting racial profiling. He agreed with all the other liberal candidates with their opposition to Prop 54, which would eliminate racial classification by the state. Tom McClintock was the only one supporting Prop 54.

An article published in the California Political Review, Oct. 1, 2003, written by Gary Bauer, states that Arnold does not believe that parents should be notified if their child is being taken off to an abortion clinic to have an abortion – so much for Republican beliefs in parental rights and family values.

If all these were not enough reasons to vote against him, in a recent interview on the Hannity & Colmes TV Show, Arnold was asked who his role models are, people he looked up to and admired. His answer was very revealing of his true inner-ultra-liberal beliefs. **Arnold said his role models are Nelson Mandela and Michel Gorbachev** – both hard-core socialist-communists, who have never denied their beliefs in such systems of government. Gorbachev now heads up the Gorbachev Foundation, an extreme-socialist group, greatly involved in promoting whacky environmental policy worldwide, whose ultimate objective is to help create a world government under a greatly empowered and expanded U.N. This is a statement made by James Garrison, co-founder and president of the Gorbachev Foundation/USA, in a 1995

ACLU Induced Indigestion

I've known conservatives who claim any mention of the ACLU can cause a bad taste in their mouth, but at a recent luncheon meeting the name generated such an intense conversation that several people actually complained of indigestion. While all present agreed that the ACLU was powerful and vehemently disagreed with their philosophy and recent lawsuits, to take God out of our Pledge of Allegiance and their attempt to stop the October Ca. recall election, few actually knew the following important details about them.

The organization has about 250,000 members, approximately 2,000 attorneys, and handles at least 6,000 cases annually, making it the largest private law firm in the country. The ACLU appears before the U.S. Supreme Court more often than any other organization except the U.S. Justice Department.

The ACLU is made up of a network of 51 state affiliates and hundreds of local chapters guided and coordinated by a national office in New York. They have active chapters on college campuses and recently initiated a major program designed to promote their philosophy on major campuses all over America. The organization has a legislative office in Washington, D.C. that handles congressional lobbying. The ACLU involves itself mostly in issues defending the rights of homosexuals, prisoners, immigrants (legal and illegal), pornography and abortion.

The ACLU Foundation's net assets are well over \$122 million. They are financed by the Ford, Rockefeller, Carnegie, Playboy and Field organizations to name just a few. They have become one of the most powerful organizations in America and a major factor in shaping our society.

What the ACLU doesn't advertise is the philosophy of their founder, Roger Baldwin,

and the goals he stated in 1920: "I am for socialism, disarmament, and ultimately for abolishing the State itself as an instrument of violence and compulsion. I seek social ownership of property, the abolition of the propertied class, and the sole control of those who produce wealth. Communism is the goal."

Although his followers today claim Baldwin became disenchanted with the Communist Party, it might be important to consider this advice he gave to an associate who was forming another group.

"Do steer away from making it look like a Socialist enterprise... We want also to look like patriots in everything we do. We want to get a good lot of flags, talk a good deal about the Constitution and what our forefathers wanted to make of this country, and to show that we are really the folks that really stand for the spirit of our institutions." (William McIlhany's "Betrayal at the Top: The Record of the American Civil Liberties Union").

It shouldn't be a surprise that the ACLU has supported abortion since before Roe v. Wade, and has argued the key cases opposing any restrictions - including abortion on demand, partial birth abortion, and a parent's right to know if their minor children are having an abortion.

The ACLU provides legal support to gain rights for homosexuals, transvestites and even pedophiles, while they fight to diminish the rights of conservative organizations. They have filed a lawsuit requiring Big Brothers of America to admit homosexuals into its mentor program for fatherless boys, and introduced numerous lawsuits against The Boy Scouts of America for expecting each Scout to believe in God and not allowing homosexuals as leaders.

The Official Policy Guide of the ACLU argues that no one should go to prison,

except for such crimes ... so serious as murder or treason.

Most alarming to me is information from Richard Thompson, chief counsel of the Thomas More Law Center, whose article "ACLU Aiming to De-Christianize Nation" stated: "The ACLU and its supporters are performing a lobotomy on the historical conscience of America by attempting to remove all references to our Christian heritage. Those who are attempting to remove all things religious from our public life are ... working to transform America from a God-fearing religious nation into a pretentious atheistic culture where biblically based beliefs are banned."

The ACLU and other liberal organizations have indeed succeeded in persuading numerous judges, professors, reporters, students, organizations, philanthropists, and business executives to support their liberal, socialist agenda and dismiss pro-life and other conservative moral positions as extreme and out of touch with the majority.

There is a battle in America for the hearts and minds of the people. The future of America could be decided by the degree Christians and conservatives become educated and energized to enter this political arena. Will you join the battle and prepare yourself to intelligently debate and defend conservative values on significant social issues? The future of America could be decided by how many of us are willing to do just that.

Board addresses parents' concern over state policy

FAIRFIELD -- Fairfield-Suisun Unified School District officials will look into adopting a policy that will require schools to notify parents if their children are leaving campus for medical reasons.

Board members said they wanted to explore the topic further after a number of parents voiced their opposition to a state law that allows students grades 7 through 12 to seek confidential medical services. Those services can include counseling for substance abuse, suicide counseling, mental health, or reproductive issues and abortions.

Other school districts in Solano County are also examining the education code closer, said Board member Bob Patillo. Vacaville Unified School District board members will discuss it at their next meeting. Other districts exploring the matter are Travis Unified School District and Dixon Unified School District, he said.

State law permits minors to seek confidential medical services but they should seek it after school, said a representative of Capitol Resource Institute, a pro-family think tank.

Twelve people spoke about the law and all but one of them said they oppose it. Parents who disagree with the law say they want to know if their child is undergoing counseling or medical procedures during school hours. The policy usurps parents' rights and discourages children from communicating with parents.

Some also brought up the case of an 18-year-old East Bay woman who died recently after she took the RU-486 pill to induce abortion. They said if she had talked to her father about her predicament, she might have received treatment sooner.

Mary Smith, a Vacaville parent said when she drops her child off at school she wants to make sure he will remain in school.

"School should be a place for education," she said.

While many of the adults said children are too young to make medical decisions, one parent said

she trusts her child.

"I don't have a problem with the education code policy," said Monica Brown, a Green Valley Middle School teacher. "I do have a daughter who is a junior. If this what she needs, she's old enough to make these decisions."

Although Fairfield High School may use the closed campus rule to keep students on campus, under the state education code groups such as American Civil Liberties Union or Children Legal Services could try to challenge it, said parent Jennifer Borges.

Patillo said the law was written to give districts the option to require parental notification or not. Board member Anne Griffin said she would like to find another way to keep "parents in the loop" about what their children are doing.

Board member Ivan Meadows said the law protects children in abusive situations.

"Not all parents are good," he said. "There are parents who are bad and abusive. These children need a way to find support and they can find it at school. As a medical doctor I've seen suicide in 12-year-olds."

Patillo replied that abused children are protected because adults must report the perpetrators to police.

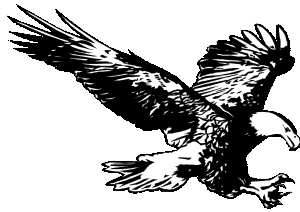

Progressive Politics

To the non-convention -going, non-politically -organization- joining Republican perhaps things are rather normal. Backroom deals rarely surface beyond the environs of the small political circles. Especially now with the leaders preaching unity dissension is more than discouraged.

Two years ago certain people in most of the counties, Orange excepted, held meetings to consider the Parsky Plan for the reorganization of the California Republican Party (CRP) Parsky is a liberal Republican and President Bush's point man in California. The Plan for reorganization was passed by voice at a hastily called convention in October 2002. A voice vote thus eliminated the proxy count. After opposition to the Parsky Plan started to arise, within a few days LA area popular talk show hosts, Hugh Hewitt and Warren Duffy devoted programs to the "Parsky plan." Callers mostly expressed opposition to it. (John Gizzi, Human Events, 2001)

A restructured Republican State Party diluted the state chairman's authority and gave major donors a seat on the executive board (Martin Wisckol, Orange County Register, 1/24/02) This resulted in eliminating the grassroots influence. In addition the President of the United States or his designee, who could be from a different state, would become an automatic member of the State Central Committee and control as many appointments as the state chairman (John Gizzi, Human Events, 2002)

Parsky is a member of the New Majority, a "moderate" well -funded

group who support abortion, gay rights and gun control. The organization has 110 members who are charged \$10,000 annually.

Besides Parsky some other New Majority members include George Argyros, a Bush appointee as ambassador to Spain, Donald Bren, Chairman of the Irvine Company, Thomas Tucker, Newport Beach venture capitalist, Paul Folino, Emulex Executive, and Henry Samueli Broadcom co-founder (Martin Wisckol, Orange County Register, 1/24/02)

John Kurzweil, editor of the California Political Review, wrote a 14 page scathing account of the events leading up to and following the take-over of the CRP. Kurzweil calls the new arrangement a GOP disconnect from the real people of California. The "moderates" have joined in with the liberal Democrats calling conservatives, mean, narrow, and other similar derogatory verbiage.

After the Republicans lost so many elections in 2002, the New Majority said the party must move quickly to groom women and minority candidates besides changing course on the environment, gun control, and abortion. They gave \$150,000 to Riordan's losing primary drive and out of nine legislative primaries picked only three winners despite investing \$277,4000 in the races. A bid by the "Majority" (some aren't even registered Republicans) to take over the Orange County Central Committee resulted in the established Republicans winning 35 of the 43 seats in the election (Martin Wisckol, Orange County Register, 3/9/02)

Some Republicans formerly opposed to the New Majority, such as Senator Dick Ackerman, are having second thoughts. A shortage of money from other sources places the New Majority in the driver's seat. Perhaps the last CRP convention on 9/15/09 was a good gage on the progress made by the moderate group. Mario Rodriquez, a renegade beat a long time volunteer, Lois Godfrey for vice chairman of the CRP. Rodriquez was picked by Bush's California director, Gerald Parsky (Orange County Register, 8/4/03) CRP Chairman, Duf Sundheim, informed the Republicans at the convention's general meeting that he was in daily contact with Karl Rove at the White House. The CRP was asked to hold only one convention rather than two in 2004 in order to spend more time on the Bush/Cheney re-election. Also, at Rove's suggestion for more focus on women, the CRP will have a woman liaison to the White House. Brooks Firestone, a former liberal legislator will be encouraged to run in the Santa Barbara area. He was very involved with Parsky in the reorganization of the CRP. Of course the New Majority are supporting Arnold Schwarzenegger. David Drier, on "staff" with Arnold has recently become a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. Parsky is also a member of that organization as well as a member of the Trilateral Commission.

Touch-Screen and Internet Voting Will Invite Election Fraud By Sharon Arada

The Voter Integrity Project of Contra Costa County directed an August letter to Secretary of State Kevin Shelley's Touch-Screen Task Force asking that the law (Proposition 41) regarding "Direct Recording Electronic" (DRE) voting devices be obeyed, that use of such machines be delayed in California until voter-verified paper records back up the electronic votes, and that the Secretary pay heed to the several hundred information technology specialists who have advised the same cautions. In part, the letter said the following:

"The professionally developed yet common-sense insistence of three Touch-Screen Task Force members (IT professionals Kim Alexander, David Dill, and David Jefferson) that any DRE voting equipment purchased now or in the future must provide for a voter-verified paper audit trail (VVPAT) has been validated independently by three Johns Hopkins researchers and a Rice University computer scientist:

"Hundreds of computer scientists have now endorsed Professor Dill's resolution, which says in part:

'Deployment of new voting machines that do not provide a voter-verifiable audit trail should be halted, and existing machines should be replaced or modified to produce ballots that can be checked independently by the voter before being submitted, and cannot be altered after submission. These ballots would count as the actual votes, taking precedence over any electronic counts....'

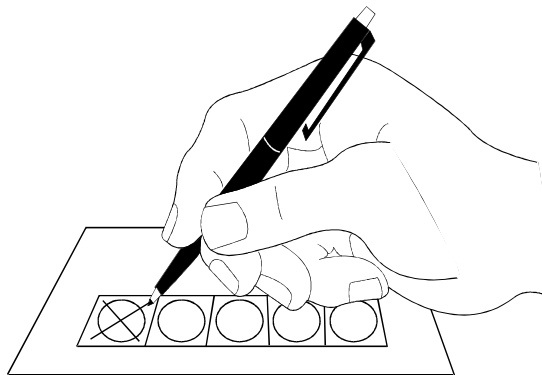
"We respectfully recommend, in light of the foregoing, that the position and direction which should appropriately now be adopted and undertaken by your office are those presented and elaborated in the Dill

Unfortunately, the majority members of Shelley's handpicked Task Force want to ignore not only the recommendations of the computer professionals, but also the clear requirements of the federal "Help America Vote Act" and California's Prop. 41, and to implement touch screen voting without the essential paper trail. Our armed services — indeed, all American citizens — must now be concerned with yet another attack on the reliability of our election results. The U.S. government awarded ELECTION.COM and Accenture, Ltd. a contract to conduct military balloting via internet.

ELECTION.COM is a once nearly-defunct company that found little success in pushing the crazy, easily compromised internet voting concept — until the company's majority share was purchased by Saudi interests. Accenture Ltd., formerly (Arthur) Andersen Consulting, a U.S. firm that incorporated in Bermuda, disclosed in July its possible violation of the U.S. Foreign Corrupt Practices Act, which prohibits bribing foreign



government officials.

Operating elections under Saudi Arabian control, or that of a company with questionable business ethics, via internet (where hacking and signal manipulation already occur far too easily, even without the fiscal incentives that altering election results could bring to the unscrupulous), is a death wish for American freedom.

We urge California's Eagles to let their state and federal representatives know that electronic voting lacking an immediately verifiable paper-audit trail and internet voting are unacceptable.

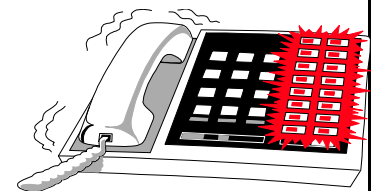

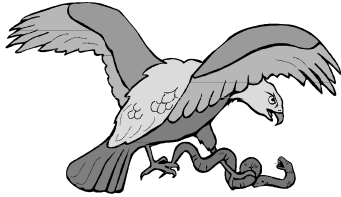
